

Born in Italy, Valeria graduated in Veterinary Medicine in Pisa. After a few months in the UK, she moved to France to train at the Veterinary School of Alfort. There she achieved a residency in diagnostic imaging, leading her to become the first Italian to obtain the ECVDI Diploma.

Now Valeria works as senior radiologist at the Veterinary Faculty of the University of Liège (ULiège-Belgium) where she is Associate Professor of large and small diagnostic imaging. Valeria is head of the diagnostic imaging service of the University Veterinary Hospital and director of the ECVDI Residency Programme at ULiège. Her main interests in diagnostic imaging are ultrasonography (in large and small animals) and teaching/learning radiology.

She believes that self-knowledge and metacognition are the solid bases for a critical diagnostic imaging practice and long-life learning. Therefore, her teaching to students is centered on cognitive processes of image acquisition and analysis, and she runs on-line coaching programs to train practicing veterinarians in critical image reading.

Passionate about human relationships and always other-oriented, she has recently trained in strategic problem-solving and brief therapy (Palo Alto model) and she practices part-time as coach for individuals and teams. Mindfulness trainer and yoga professor, she also holds a short training course in interpersonal mindfulness for veterinary students.
